How to become a dentist

- Study the right A-Levels – you will typically need high grades in **Chemistry, Biology** and **Physics** or **Mathematics** to be accepted onto a Dentistry degree course
- Complete a Dentistry undergraduate degree. This typically takes five years to complete
- Dentistry is a very competitive field, you are required to sit a Clinical Aptitude test before being admitted into a dental school
- Once you have completed a Dentistry degree you can qualify as a dentist. If you want to practise in a particular field, you may have to undertake further study
- As with all professions, work experience in Dentistry will aid your understanding of the field and make you instantly more employable

Types of Dentistry

General dentistry

Primary dental care providers for patients of all ages, They take responsibility for the diagnosis, treatment and coordination of services to ensure overall oral health.

Hospital dentistry

Deals with cases of special difficulty or provides treatment to long-stay in-patients or emergency treatment to short-stay patients.

Orthodontics

Specialist field of dentistry which deals with diagnosis, treatment and prevention of malpositioned teeth and jaws.

There are many other fields of dentistry that you can specialise in. Do some research and find the one that interests you most!

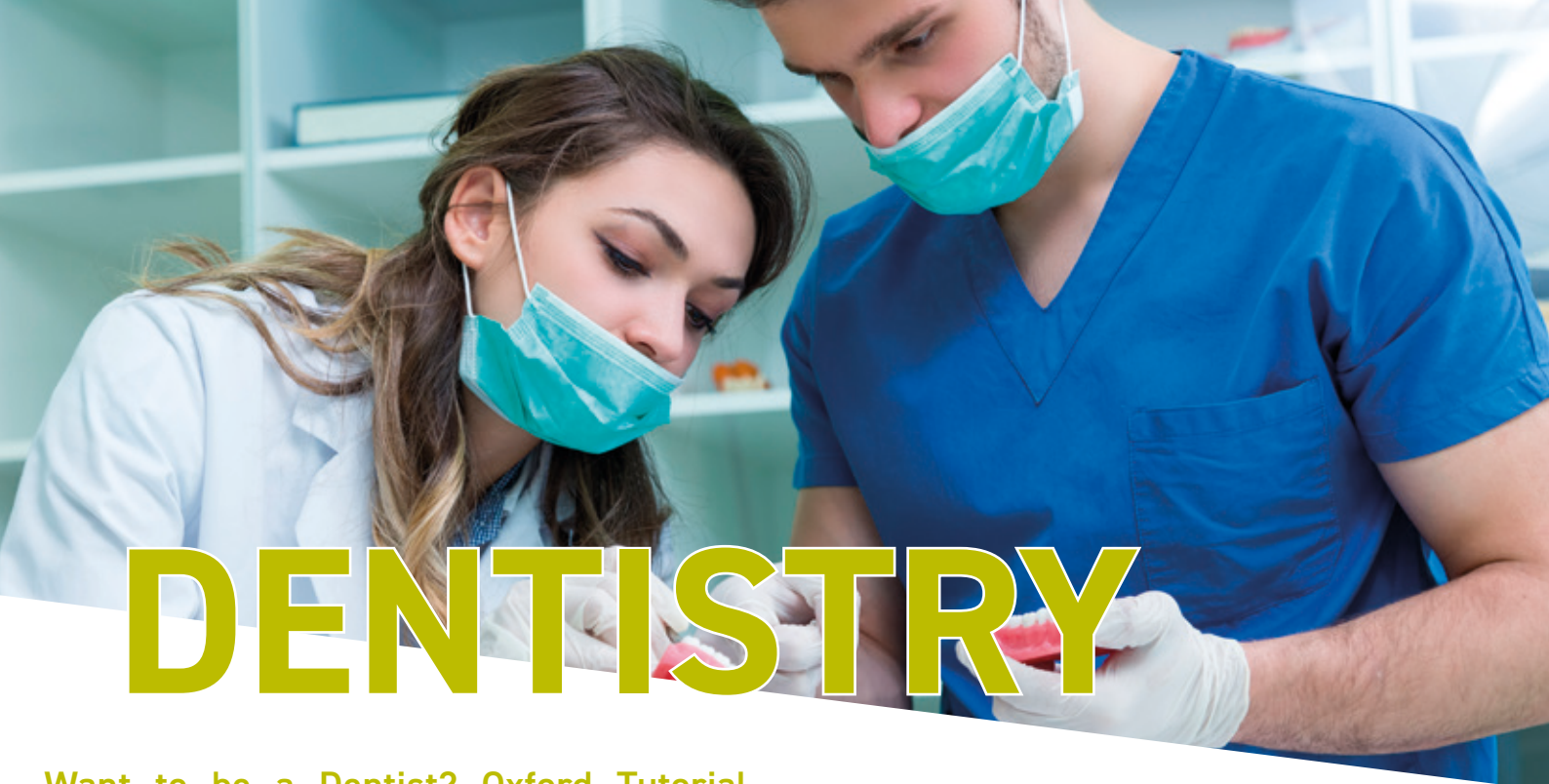
