How to become an lawyer

- Pass your A-Levels – There are no specific subjects that you are required to study at A-Level, but essay-based subjects such as **History** or **English Literature** will be helpful at degree level
- Complete an undergraduate degree in Law. Alternatively, study another subject and then take a two-year conversion course
- To become a barrister – take the Bar Professional Training Course, followed by a pupillage (practical experience in a barrister’s chambers). You are then free to practise as a barrister
- To become a solicitor – complete a vocational Legal Practice Course before undertaking a training contract with a law firm. You can then apply for admission to the roll of solicitors
- Experience is key – ensure you gain as much practical experience as possible throughout your training

Types of Lawyer

Solicitor

A confidential adviser, combining expertise and people skills to provide legal advice and assistance. They are qualified to deal with conveyancing, drawing up of wills and may also sometimes represent clients in court.

Barrister

A specialist legal adviser and courtroom advocate. They are independent, objective and trained to advise clients in the strengths and weaknesses of their case.

Criminal lawyer

Specialises in the defence of individuals and companies charged with criminal activity.

Corporate lawyer

Specialises in law that applies to the rights, relations and conduct of people, companies, organisations and businesses.

Family lawyer

Deals with family matters and domestic relations including personal relationships, relationship breakdowns and children in the context of separation or divorce.
